

Geography Following our Spring term focus on the Geography of World War Two, the children will investigate the Commonwealth. By the end of the unit, they will be able to explain what the Commonwealth is and know more about countries which belong to the Commonwealth. Through a range of activities, they will strengthen their map reading and research skills.

Design and Technology Drawing upon their knowledge of evacuation and migration, the children will design and make a toy for an evacuee.

RE- How can we make our town a more respectful place? The children will learn about the features of different places of worship and explore the symbolism of items found within churches and gurdwaras. They will also consider how religion and religious teaching can help to build a sense of community.

Science

Animals, including humans. There will be a focus on healthy lifestyles, where the children will learn about the effects of exercise and drugs on the body.

Electricity The children will complete a range of experiments to build on their knowledge of circuits.

English In the Summer term, children will explore the features of a range of fiction and non-fiction. Through independent reading and within comprehension activities, children will retrieve information and make inferences and predictions. They will write for a range of purposes and audiences and demonstrate their ability to select appropriate vocabulary and punctuation.

Mathematical Skills

By consolidating and developing mental and written methods of calculation and through a wide range of reasoning and problem solving activities, the children will demonstrate their understanding of different areas of the Maths curriculum:

- Shape
- Statistics
- Algebra

History Having previously studied World War Two, the children will be able to further explore the impact of conflict and natural disasters as they learn about human migration. Through their learning, they will develop their enquiry skills as they read and interpret a range of both primary and secondary sources of evidence. This unit will also provide the opportunity for the children to reflect on their community and the history/ journeys of their own families.

Art and Design Using a range of skills and techniques, the children will explore self-portraits and produce artwork, which reflects different styles and eras. They will also learn about the work of key portrait artists like Picasso.

Computing

Bletchley Park In our first Computing unit of the term, the children will crack codes and learn about the role of computers in helping to win World War Two.

Big Data With an emphasis on more modern technology, the children will see how information is communicated from one device to another.
